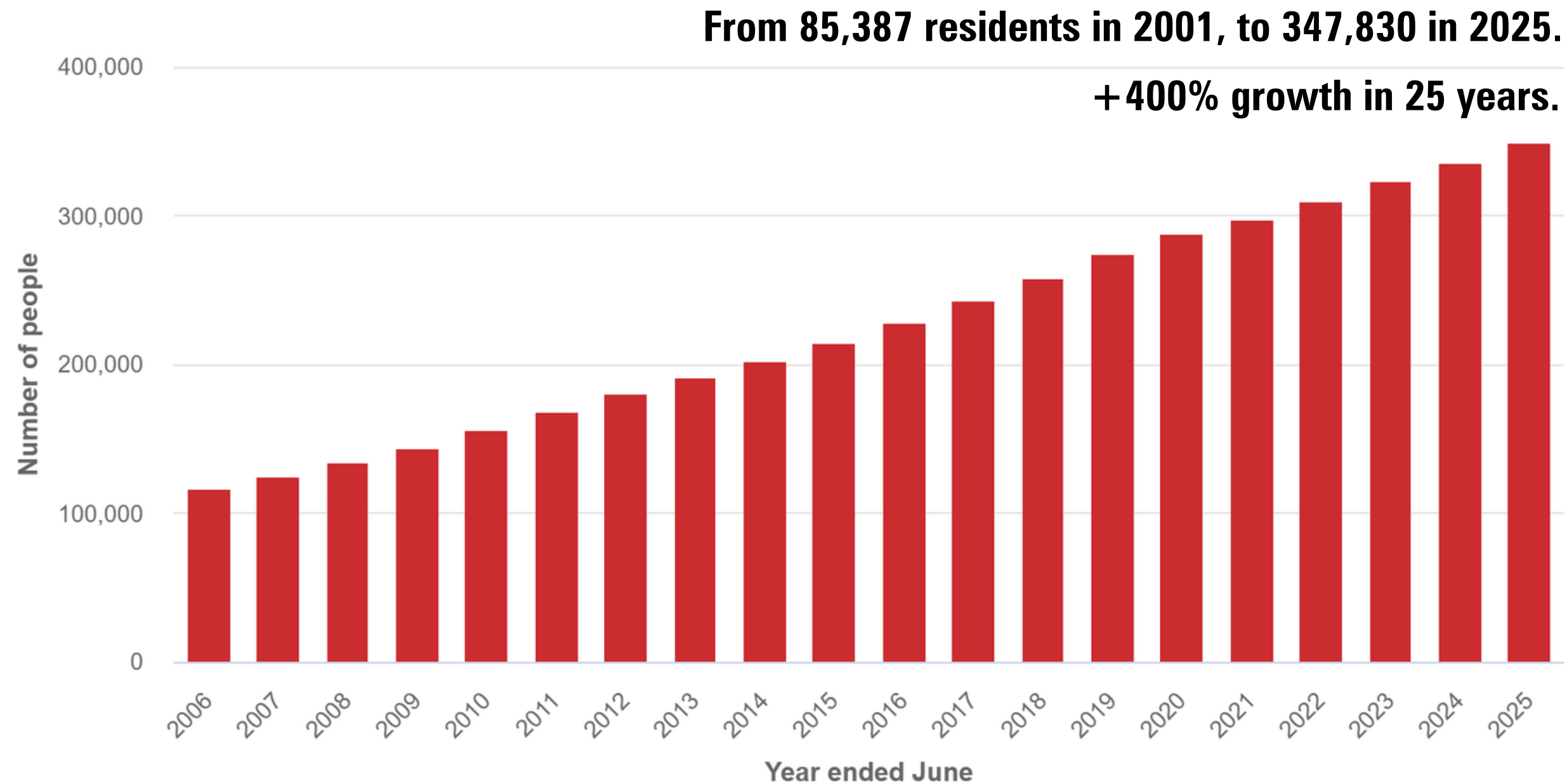

City of Wyndham



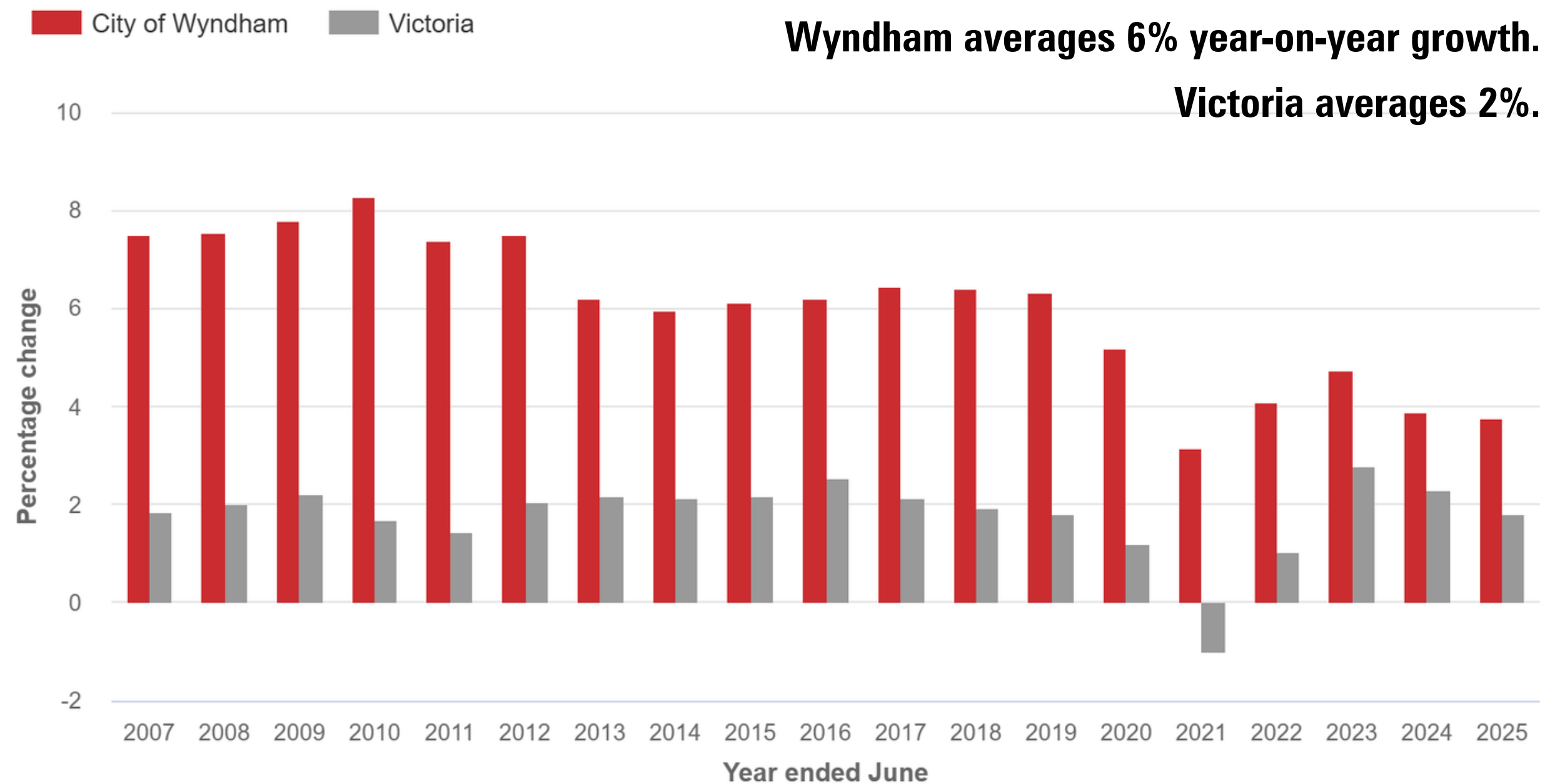
Wyndham's demography is...

Percentage change in ERP - City of Wyndham compared to Victoria



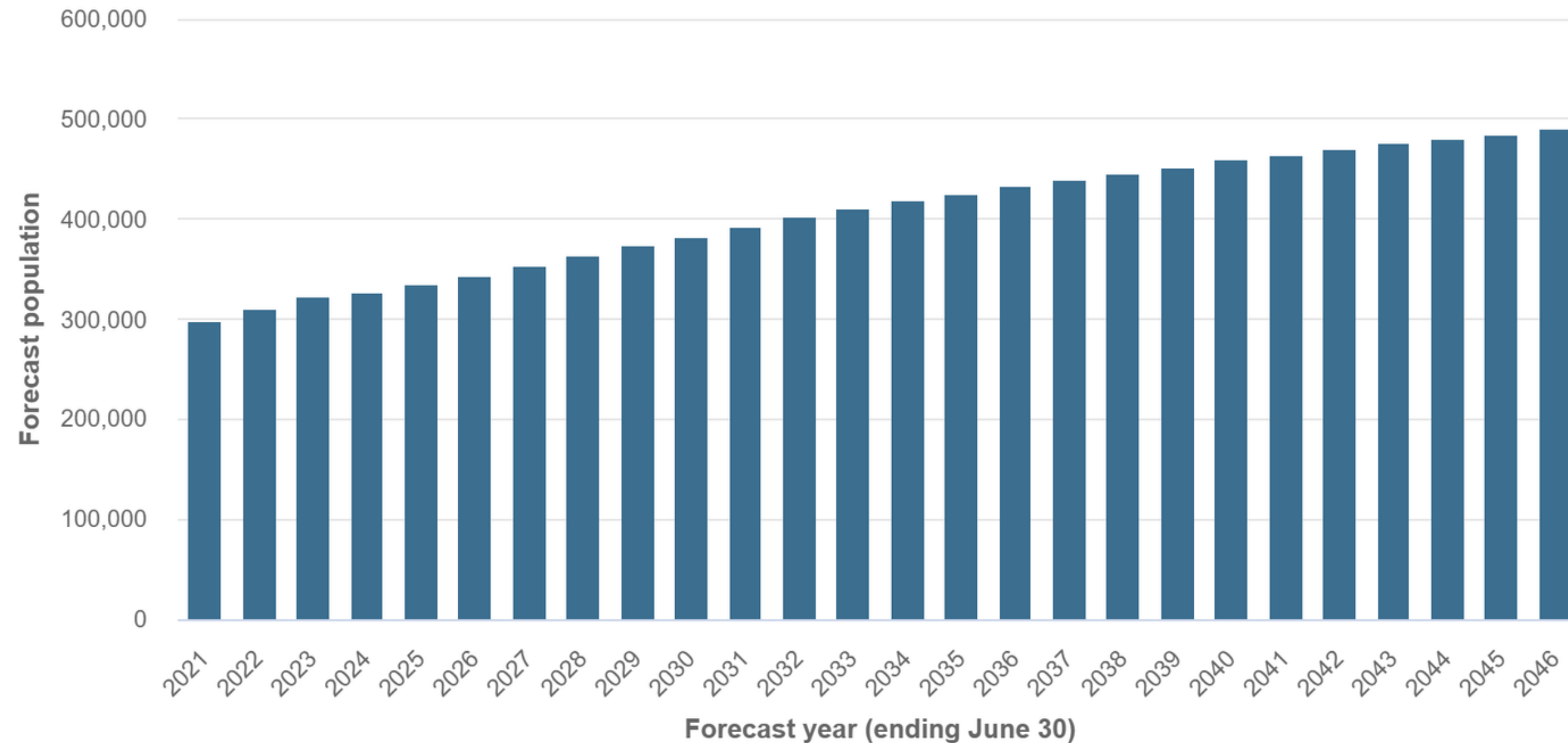

Wyndham Vale – North (+28k)

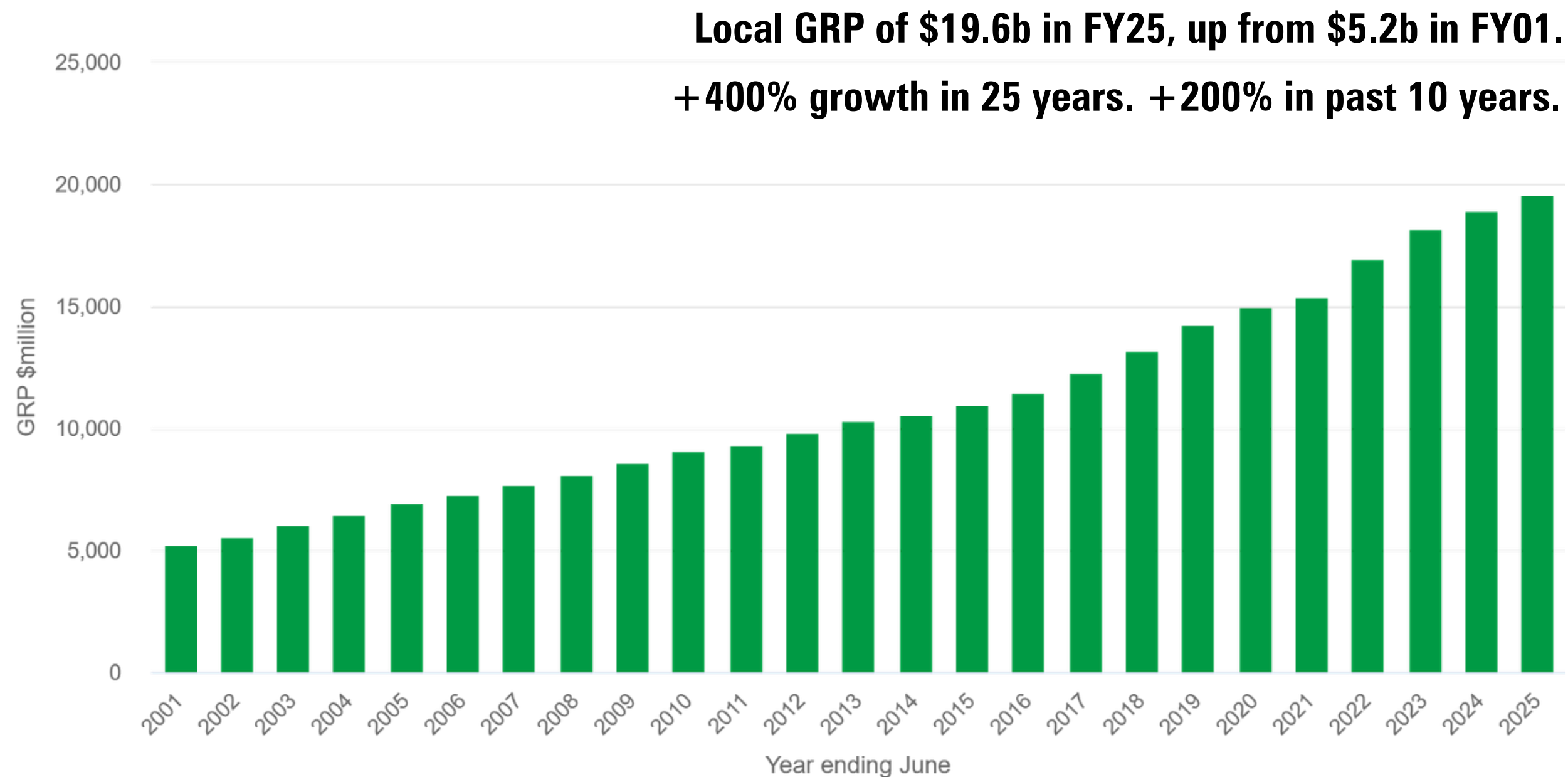
-Werribee - South (+24k)

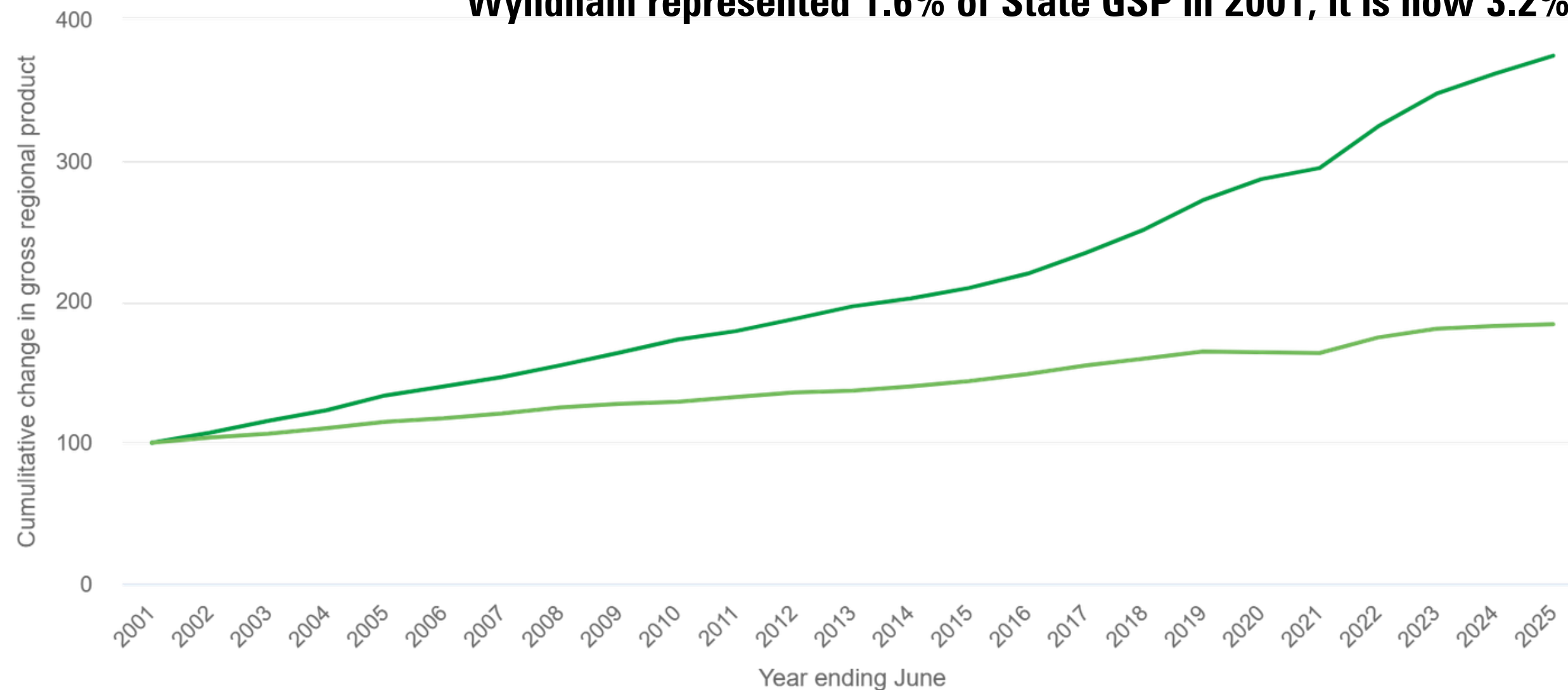
Cumulative change in Gross Regional Product

Social & Community Infrastructure that delivers essential services, driving connection, safety and advancing liveability:

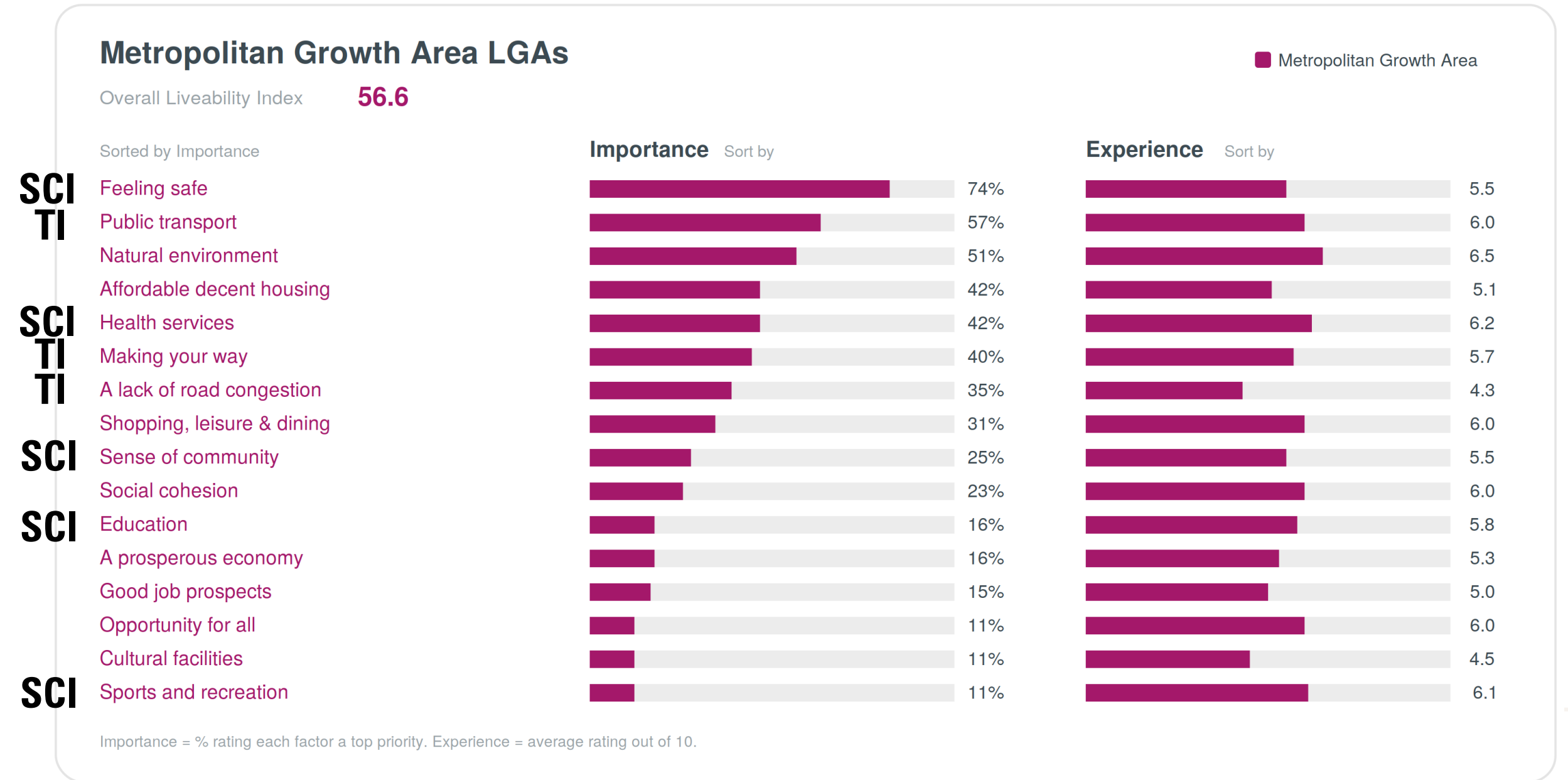
- **Werribee Mercy Hospital & Mental Health Services**

Why focus on Transport and Social Infrastructure?

Because Metropolitan Growth Area residents place a high value on but often report poor local area experiences for liveability attributes related to transport and social infrastructure.

Improving local area experiences for Transport Infrastructure and Social & Community Infrastructure related items is the key to unlocking long-term quality of life improvement for MGA residents.

No investment, insufficient or poorly sequenced investment will result in liveability decline.



Why focus on Transport and Social Infrastructure?

We see this in places with similar characteristics to the City of Wyndham, like the City of Ipswich.

Transport Infrastructure:

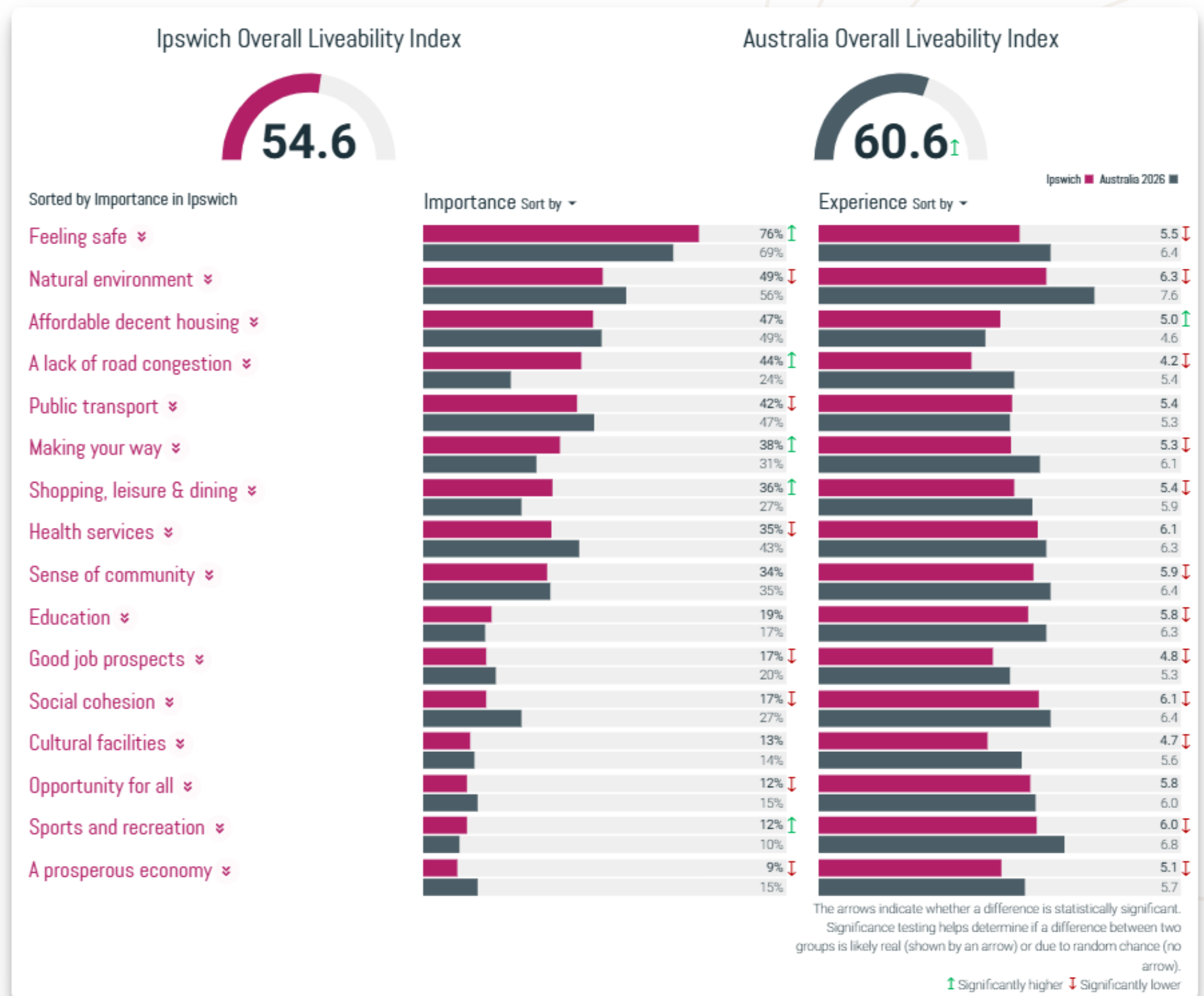
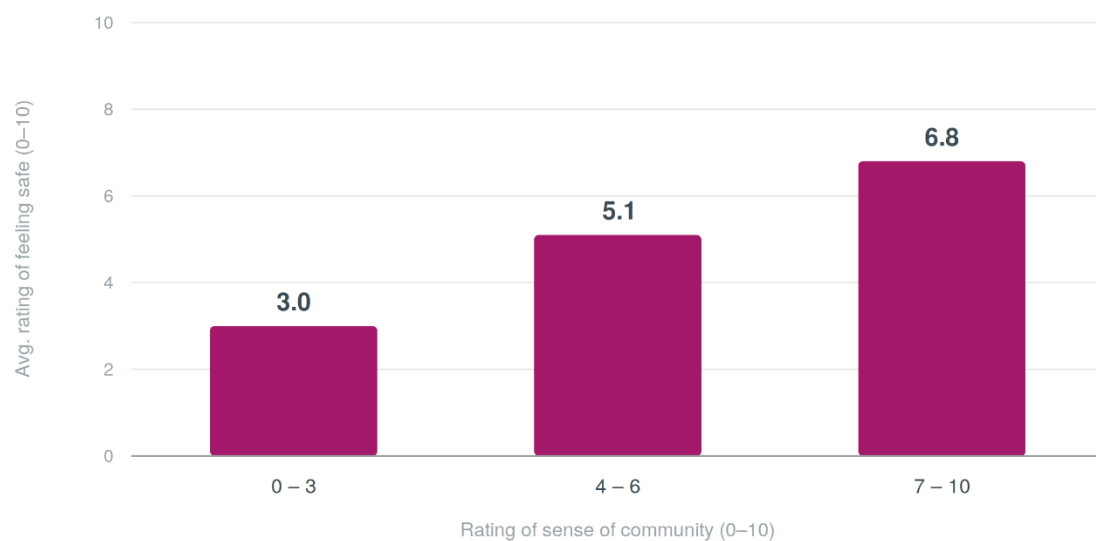
- 3 of residents' most important items, among the poorest experiences.
